

Five Surgical Procedures that Cost More than Half A Million Dollar

The society this time needs more professionals who are capable of providing the best health services especially to ailing individuals. Becoming a surgeon is just one of the careers a person with dedication to help others by improving their health condition could push through. But expect that acquiring this profession is not that easy. Aside from that fact that obtaining doctor's degree is an expensive process, one has to double the years that typical students stay at school.

However, there are also a couple of good reasons that make surgeon an extremely rewarding profession for persons with such calling. Apart from helping to uplift the health condition of an ailing individual, these professionals who are adept in using surgical instruments can also expect for a relatively high salary. Based on the survey conducted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics in 2010 regarding the salary of surgeons, it revealed that said medical practitioner could earn an average of \$365,258 per year. And if that professional who is primarily tasked to make use of [surgical instruments](#) practiced major or more complex medical specialties, then expect for a much higher salary.

By the way, this post features the five most expensive organ transplant that highly skilled surgeon might perform. They are considered the most expensive organ transplant because the preliminary testing, the surgery, and the post-operative recovery expenses, when summed up, are worth more than half a million dollar. Not to mention the miscellaneous fees that might be charged to the patients for additional medical products like supportive stockings, binders, or sling.

Intestine Transplant

A very rare and risky procedure that cost around \$1,121,800. The price would even go up if multiple intestinal organs are included in the said procedure. An intestinal transplant is often the last option to treat patients with intestinal failure. Patients who are suffering from intestinal failure are unable to digest food or absorb the fluids, electrolytes, and nutrients essential for life.

Doctor's Fee: \$100,600

Heart Transplant

A heart transplant is the second most expensive procedure, which cost about \$787,700. Plus, the expensive procurement of replacement organ to the overall transplant cost. Heart transplant is being considered as the most advanced treatment for end-stage heart disease wherein it provides hope to patients who might die due to heart problems. It is a known fact that once a person grows old, his or her major organs will become weak and the heart is not an exemption.

Doctor's Fee: \$50,800

Bone Marrow Transplant

Replacing a person's bone marrow is indeed expensive especially if the new bone marrow comes from a donor. Aside from the medical costs which is normally around \$676,800, there are still some

additional out of the pocket expenses. In patients with leukemia, aplastic anemia, and some immune deficiency disorders; the diseased bone marrow is removed and replaced with a healthy marrow that is infused into his or her bloodstream.

Lung Transplant

Lung transplant is a long procedure and costs high. Single replacement of person's lung would cost about \$450,400. But if both the left and right lung will be transplanted, the entire operation would cost as much as \$657,800. Lung transplant is often the last treatment option being given by medical specialists who are adept in using those surgical instruments to patients with chronic lung disorder like emphysema or cystic fibrosis.

Doctor's Fee: \$27,900

Liver Transplant

Liver transplant is another risky surgical procedure that requires long stay at the hospital for recovery. Expenses included in this ultimate procedure that medical specialists performed to patients with end-stage cirrhosis, liver cancer, and other chronic liver disorder. Estimated average cost of liver transplant is \$657,800.

Doctor's Fee: \$77,800
